Call Meeting to Order:

Chairman Candelaria calls the meeting to order at 9:00 am, he welcomes all those present to the meeting. He leads us in the pledge and the prayer.

Approval of the Meeting Minutes:

Chairman Candelaria asks for a motion to approve the April 8, 2015 Regular Meeting Minutes. **ACTION TAKEN:** Madam Commissioner DuCharme makes a motion to approve the April 8, 2015 Regular Meeting Minutes. Commissioner Frost seconds the motion. No further discussion. The Commissioners vote; all in favor, none opposed. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Approval of the Meeting Agenda:

Chairman Candelaria asks for a motion to approve today's Meeting Agenda. **ACTION TAKEN:** Commissioner Frost makes a motion to approve today's Commission Meeting Agenda. Madam Commissioner DuCharme seconds the motion. Commissioner Frost asks if agenda items #11 and #13 be moved up at the discretion of the Chair. The Commission agrees to this. The Commissioners vote to approve the agenda. All in favor, none opposed. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Approval of the Consent Agenda, approval of warrants, and approval of indigent claims: Chairman Candelaria asks for a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. **ACTION TAKEN:** Commissioner Frost makes a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Chairman Candelaria seconds the motion. Madam Commissioner DuCharme asks a few questions. She asks about a payment to CNMEC in the amount of \$59.84 for the Tajique Community Center. Ms. Ansley replies that this will be the last payment for the center. She asks about a payment to Honstein Oil Co. in the amount of \$12,187.03 for fuel for the Road Department; she inquires about getting a report from the Road Department outlining their work and fuel usage. Chairman Candelaria suggests Madam Commission DuCharme ask the Road Department as they have provided him with this information in the past. She now asks about a payment to EMW Gas in the amount of \$160.89 for the Fair Grounds. Ms. Ansley replies that the Fair Grounds are used throughout the year, not just during the Fair and even when no one is using it, there will still be a water and power bill. Madam Commissioner DuCharme now asks about a payment to EVSWA in the amount of \$3,700.00 for recycling/ hauling. Ms. Ansley replies this is part of the tire grant that was approved recently; they are hauling tires to Denver City. Lastly, Madam Commissioner DuCharme is asking about a payment to Walmart in the amount of \$500 for Mountainair Prom Incentives (Drug-Free, Alcohol Free Event). Ms. Ansley replies that we do this every year; the money comes from the Drug Education fund. There is a committee set up by Magistrate Court and the County administers the funds. Any of the high schools in Tarrant County can request these funds. No further discussion. The Commissioners vote; all in favor, none opposed **MOTION CARRIED.**

Action Items

Items to Be Considered and Acted Upon

***Department Requests/Reports:**

1. Updates:

Leslie Olivas, Purchasing Director, speaks. The NMAC conference will be in June this year in Albuquerque. New Mexico Edge is offering a basic purchasing and procurement class for non-purchasing professionals. Her office will pay for the class for any of the Commissioners who would like to take it. It offers a great

overview of the processes that Ms. Olivas must follow with the State Procurement Code.

Annette Ortiz, Deputy County Manager, speaks. During her recent HR Affiliate meeting, there was a presentation from The Education Plan. Ms. Michelle Neill Tange, the Outreach Coordinator for The Education Plan gives a brief overview of their program. The Education Plan is New Mexico's 529 college savings plan. It is a tax advantage way to save for college. As you put money in, it reduces your income tax because you can write off the contributions at the end of the year. It grows tax free and you can withdraw it tax free as long as the funds are used for education. You can start with as little as \$25.00 a month. Ms. Ortiz reminds all that today is Administrative Professionals Day; thank you to everyone who works so hard day in and day out to keep the County running!

Lt. John Stocum, Sheriff's Department, speaks. They had 274 Boy Scouts at the Camporee last weekend. It was a great success and the park is very clean. Lt. Stocum informs the Commission that he did not realize it, but another group of Boy Scouts will participate in another Camporee this weekend. There is insurance for this weekend as well. He asks if the Boy Scouts can use the park again. The Commission agrees to allow this.

Commissioner Frost speaks. He held his local Road Department policy meeting. The attendance at the meeting was low, but it went well.

Madam Commissioner DuCharme speaks. She has held one Road Department policy meeting in her District already, and will have another this Saturday, April 25th @ 2:00pm at the McIntosh Senior Center. Attendance at her first meeting was low; she encourages all interested to attend. She also reminds all that today is Earth Day and a great day to start recycling.

Chairman Candelaria speaks. He also held a Road Department policy meeting in the Duran area. There was a mix-up on the time of the meeting and some people showed up after Chairman Candelaria left; Chairman Candelaria has offered to meet with those people individually. 25-30 people showed up to the meeting at the Torreon Community Center and it went very well.

Chairman Candelaria states that he went with Mr. Martin Gutierrez from the Road Department to check on the condition of a road, BO16, which goes to the Deer Canyon Subdivision. He discovered, much to his surprise, that Mr. David Pettingill had repaired two miles of the road at his own cost. Chairman Candelaria takes this opportunity to publicly thank Mr. Pettingill.

11. Presentation by International Trade Alliance & Request for Fiscal Assistance- Randy Trask Ms. Myra Pancrazio from EVEDA speaks. She introduces Mr. Randy Trask from the Albuquerque-Bernalillo County International Trade Alliance. In summary, he is here today to request \$2,500 from Torrance County to partially fund an “Albuquerque Metro International Transportation and Logistics Hub Feasibility Study.” The estimated cost of the study will be \$150,000. The Trade Alliance is fundraising \$75,000 and has applied for a \$75,000 EDA Planning Assistance Grant match to cover the remaining portion of the expense. The study is needed to gather the data necessary to identify what must be done to leverage existing global, state and local trends, and infrastructure to position Greater Albuquerque as an International Transportation and Logistics Hub. The collection and analysis of this data will provide a framework to begin the strategic planning that is necessary to accomplish this goal. The study will consist of three components: A competitiveness and feasibility analysis; a freight market study and model development; and an initial high-level strategic plan. The results of the study will be adopted by the Albuquerque metro area and implemented as a regional economic development project. Successful implementation of this study could lead to significant job creation, especially in the value added manufacturing and transportation sectors. After some discussion, the Commission agrees to support this endeavor. All documentation hereto attached. **ACTION TAKEN** Commissioner Frost makes a motion to provide fiscal assistance to this project. Chairman Candelaria seconds the motion. No further discussion. The Commissioners vote. Two in favor, Madam Commissioner DuCharme abstains. **MOTION CARRIED.**

13. Presentation by Boys & Girls Club Mr. David Tixier speaks. Mr. Tixier sits on the Board for the Boy & Girls Club as well as the Board for EVEDA. Mr. Tixier gives a brief presentation outlining all the benefits of this organization and particularly the benefits to the youth of our County. In summary, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Central New Mexico will serve the children of our community by offering a framework for youth development and proven, nationally recognized programs. These programs and services are designed to promote and enhance the

development of our youth by instilling a sense of competence, usefulness, belonging and a positive self-image. They are focused on serving underprivileged youth, ages 5 to 18. They are looking forward to serving youth in Torrance and Santa Fe County kids in the Estancia Valley as they expand into Moriarty. The Club, housed in the former Mountainview Elementary School, will provide programming to kids all day during the summer and after school during the school year. They are requesting \$20,000 from Torrance County to help jump start the program locally. The City of Moriarty has designated \$20,000 to the program and they will meet with the Commission of Santa Fe County to discuss financial support from them. They are also looking into grant support. Scholarships will also be funded by various organizations in the area. Ms. Gabrielle Anaya also speaks about the program. Mr. Wallin, County Attorney, states that he is still very concerned that this may be an anti-donation issue and requests time to look into this further before the Commission makes a decision. The Commission requests that Mr. Wallin research this item and thanks Mr. Tixier and Ms. Anaya for their presentation today. All documentation hereto attached. **NO ACTION, INFORMATION ONLY**

At this time, the Commission takes a short ten minute break.

2. Contract for Services between Torrance County and AECOM- Javier Sanchez, Emergency Manager Mr. Sanchez speaks. This item is not ready to be presented. All documentation hereto attached. **ACTION TAKEN.** Commissioner Frost makes a motion to table this item. Madam Commissioner DuCharme seconds the motion. The Commissioners vote; all in favor, none opposed. **ITEM TABLED.**

3. Request Payment of Powerphone Invoice- Ben Daugherty, Dispatch Supervisor Ms. Ansley presents this item. Dispatch thought they had turned in this purchase order request, but later found the original request among some paperwork. The employee did receive the training and the amount of the invoice is \$135.61. Madam Commissioner DuCharme states that she hopes the lesson has been learned and this will not occur again in the future. All documentation hereto attached. **ACTION TAKEN.** Commissioner Frost makes a motion to approve payment of the Powerphone Invoice. Chairman Candelaria seconds the motion. The Commissioners vote; all in favor, none opposed. **MOTION CARRIED.**

4. Valuation Maintenance Plan 2015-2018 for Torrance County Assessor's Office- Betty Cabber, Assessor Ms. Cabber is not available to present this item. All documentation hereto attached. **ACTION TAKEN.** Madam Commissioner DuCharme makes a motion to table this item. Commissioner Frost seconds the motion. The Commissioners vote; all in favor, none opposed. **ITEM TABLED.**

5. Award RFP 2015-04 Audit Services – Leslie Olivas, Purchasing Director Ms. Olivas speaks. She has presented the Commission with a packet containing the RFP for Audit services that the County published, a list of the firms that submitted proposals, a blank copy of the OSA provided recommendation form, and the contract that would be generated from this RFP. On March 11th, Ms. Ansley advised the Commission that the County would be putting out an RFP for Audit services. The notice was published on April 2nd. The submission deadline was April 14th. We received four proposals. Last Thursday, the evaluation committee met and went through all the proposals and a unanimous recommendation was reached. The recommendation to the Commission is to award this RFP to REDW, LLC. All documentation hereto attached. **ACTION TAKEN.** Commissioner Frost makes a motion to award the RFP 2015-04 Audit Services to REDW, LLC Services. Chairman Candelaria seconds the motion. Madam Commissioner DuCharme asks why the Commission received blank forms in their packet. Ms. Olivas replies that the contract is blank because it cannot be filled out until the Commission awards the RFP. Madam Commissioner DuCharme asks what information the Commission has to approve this recommendation and who is on the evaluation committee. Ms. Olivas replies that the County is required to follow the NM Procurement Code and that is what we did; we used the correct RFP process. The committee member's names cannot be released in an open meeting; she would be happy to discuss this with Madam Commissioner DuCharme in closed session if she would like. Madam Commissioner DuCharme states that on the information provided she cannot make a decision. Chairman Candelaria comments that he has been through this type of thing several times before and the bids contain critical information that cannot be released to the public. He further states that he is confident that our committee went through the right steps to make this award recommendation. No further discussion. The Commissioners vote. Two in favor, Madam Commissioner DuCharme opposed. **MOTION CARRIED.**

6. Ratify FY13 Special EMG Grant – Javier Sanchez, Emergency Manager

All documentation hereto attached. Mr. Sanchez speaks. He clarifies that this grant needs to be approved, not ratified. Some time ago Mr. Sanchez came before the Commission in order to seek approval of an application to submit to the Dept. of Homeland Security for a Special grant. The grant has been awarded so a sub-grant agreement has been issued to the County for our signature. The total awarded amount is \$198,240.00. The local match is \$99,120.00, a 50% match. Mr. Sanchez has received letters from participating jurisdictions: Moriarty, Encino, Estancia, and Mountainair. The letters endorse the amount that they are willing to match in order to have the project described in the sub-grant agreement carried through. Mr. Sanchez states that he has met with the Grant Committee and has spoken with the County Attorney. Mr. Wallin has recommended creating an MOA that would commit the participating jurisdictions to the amounts stipulated in the letters. The commitment amounts are as follows: Moriarty- \$32,500.00, Encino- \$2,500.00, Estancia- \$5,000.00, Mountainair- \$12,500.00. The remainder of the match would come from the Fire and Law Enforcement budgets. **ACTION TAKEN.**

Commissioner Frost makes a motion to approve the FY13 Special EMG Grant. Chairman Candelaria seconds the motion. This is not an in-kind match, it is a cash match. Dispatch is implementing a new CAD system in order to share information. It will be a platform that will need to be interfaced by the units in the field. In order to accomplish that, there is laptop called a tough book that needs to be installed in each unit. After some discussion, the Commission requests that Mr. Sanchez confirm with Fire and Law Enforcement that together they can meet the remainder of the cash match- \$46,620.00. Mr. Sanchez will obtain written commitments from Fire and Law Enforcement and come back to the Commission for approval. The Commission agrees to schedule a Special Meeting to take action on this item once the commitment letters are received. The Commission tentatively schedules the Special Meeting for Monday April 27th @ 9:00 AM. **ACTION TAKEN:** Commissioner Frost makes a motion to table this item. Madam Commissioner DuCharme seconds the motion. No further discussion. The Commissioners vote. All in favor, none opposed. **ITEM TABLED.**

7. Request Out-of-State Travel and Actual Expenses to Colorado – Tracey Master, DWI Grant Coordinator

Ms. Master is not available to present this item. The Commission decides to table this item. All documentation hereto attached. **ACTION TAKEN.** Madam Commissioner DuCharme makes a motion to table this item. Commissioner Frost seconds the motion. No further discussion. The Commissioners vote. All in favor, none opposed. **ITEM TABLED.**

At this time, the Commission takes a short ten minute break.

8. Resolution 2015-015 Authorizing Torrance County to Submit an Application to the Department of Finance & Administration to participate in the Juvenile Adjudication Program- Tracey Master, DWI Grant Coordinator

Ms. Ansley presents this item. On April 8th, the Commission approved the grant application for the Juvenile Adjudication Fund. The grant amount is \$5,263.16. This will be supplemental funding for the Teen Court program. This is the resolution that is required by DFA authorizing the submission of that grant application. All documentation hereto attached. **ACTION TAKEN** Madam Commissioner DuCharme makes a motion to approve Resolution 2015-015. Commissioner Frost seconds the motion. No further discussion. The Commissioners vote. All in favor, none opposed. **MOTION CARRIED.**

9. Approval of FY16 Fire Budgets Ms. Ansley speaks. These are the annual Fire Protection Fund Applications. We do these every year; they must be submitted on or before April 30, 2015. Ms. Ansley reads the fund amounts for admin and each district. *(Both the town of Willard and the County will submit applications for the Willard Fire Station).* All documentation hereto attached. **ACTION TAKEN** Commissioner Frost makes a motion to approve the FY16 Fire Budgets. Chairman Candelaria seconds the motion. Madam Commissioner DuCharme asks why the Commission was not provided with this information earlier. Ms. Ansley replies that she gave them to the Commission as soon as she received them which was approximately 9:30 this morning. The application calls for a roll over amount for each district, so the admin waits till the last minute to submit so this number will be accurate. No further discussion. The Commissioners vote. All in favor, none opposed. **MOTION CARRIED.**

10. New Mexico Office of the State Auditor Presentation and Discussion

Mr. Kevin Sourisseau, CPA, Special Investigation Director from the Office of the State Auditor speaks. He is here today at the Commission's request. As we know, the Office of the State Auditor released a Special Audit with findings at the end of December of 2014. It is the understanding of his office that the Attorney General is still reviewing files and may turn those files over to the State Police at some point if they believe that it is warranted. Since the release of the Special Audit, the State Auditor's Office has requested that the County go out for RFP and select a different auditor for this year, which he sees that the County has done. Other than

that, he stands for questions. Commissioner Frost has no questions. Madam Commissioner DuCharme asks for Mr. Sourisseau's opinion about the process the County followed in selecting a new auditor. Mr. Sourisseau states that he is not completely familiar with the County's processes, but from what he has heard today, it seems appropriate. He can say that REDW is a very large firm and conducts a significant amount of audits throughout the state. Madam Commissioner DuCharme asks about a letter Deputy State Officer Mr. Bhakta sent to the County requesting that the Procurement Officer report directly to the Commission. Mr. Sourisseau states that is true; that is a recommendation of the Office. He states that he believes that within that letter or in a subsequent letter the Office recommended that, if the County had concerns about how to implement procurement policies that the County work with an independent accounting firm that is not part of any County financial audit. Madam Commissioner DuCharme states that she tried to persuade her fellow Commissioners to follow this recommendation but she was unsuccessful. Mr. Sourisseau reiterates that it is a recommendation. Torrance County will be audited again this year, a new firm will be coming in and there will be additional test work required to look at the audit findings from the Special Audit. With the new firm, there will be fresh eyes looking at the audit. Madam Commissioner DuCharme asks what Mr. Sourisseau's words or wish is for us. Mr. Sourisseau states that State Auditor Keller's vision is that we work forward with audit findings and there is progress in clearing those findings. Chairman Candelaria states that we have submitted the procedures that we are currently using and ask that the Office of the State Auditor look at them and give us any input and/or recommendations that they think is necessary. He states that our whole goal is to do a better job. The Commission thanks Mr. Sourisseau for his time. **NO ACTION, DISCUSSION ONLY**

12. Request Noise Ordinance for Torrance County- Bill Mohney, Resident, speaks. The County has made many improvements, but the one thing we do not have is a noise or nuisance ordinance. The way it is now, if you call the Sheriff's Department to complain, they come out but with a very vague state law that is hard to enforce. And they keep coming out to the same nuisances over and over again. Mr. Mohney has presented the Commission with copy of a proposed Ordinance titled 'An Ordinance Relating to Nuisances; Health and Sanitation'. *(A copy of the proposed ordinance is included in the file for this meeting)*. This is very similar to the ordinance that Moriarty has already adopted. He is proposing that the County adopt a Nuisance/Noise Ordinance to give the Sheriff's Department something they can use. Mr. Mohney resides in Commission District 2, near Indian Hills and states that he has heard from the Sheriff's Department that they would love to have

an ordinance of this kind. Madam Commissioner DuCharme asks Mr. Mohney what prompted him to propose this ordinance. He replies that he brought this up to the last Commission and it really didn't go anywhere. He just believes that this is something that we need as the County gets more populated. Madam Commissioner DuCharme ask Mr. Wallin for an opinion. Mr. Wallin comments that he drafted the ordinance for Moriarty. There is State law. Nuisances can be very subjective and difficult to enforce. It is his recollection that when the Commission was approached with this before, they were hesitant to act on it as living in a municipality is very different from living out in the County. Certainly there are instances that come up in the County that could constitute nuisances and those are traditionally dealt with under State law. After discussion, the Commission decides that it is interested in looking into this further. Madam Commissioner DuCharme will spearhead this. Ms. Ansley will provide the Commissioners with copies of the nuisance abatement ordinance draft that we already have. All documentation hereto attached. **NO ACTION, DISCUSSION ONLY**

14. Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, PG Enterprises, LLC Mr.

Wallin speaks. This is a reflection of the findings and conclusions that the Commission made at the end of the public hearing held concerning the request for a Special Use change in zoning to allow PG Enterprises, LLC to operate a rock, sand, and aggregate mining operation. This allows anyone contesting the decision to know how and why the Commission reached its decision. If the contesting party appeals, a court can determine whether the legal conclusions are correct. All documentation hereto attached. **ACTION TAKEN** Commissioner Frost makes a motion to approve the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, PG Enterprises, LLC. Chairman Candelaria seconds the motion. Madam DuCharme states that she disagrees with one item on this document. No further discussion. The Commissioners vote. Two in favor, Madam Commissioner DuCharme opposed. **MOTION CARRIED.**

***County Manager Requests/Reports:**

15. Update Ms. Ansley presents the Commission the following report:

1. On 4/29 NMAC will present the Legislative Summary in Santa Rosa. 10:00AM- 2:00PM. The Commission will attend.
2. NMAC sent a letter to Ms. Ansley stating that they want Torrance County to consider a resolution asking Governor Martinez to call a

Special Session to discuss Capital Outlay. A draft resolution will be on the next agenda for the Commission to consider.

3. The County is beginning the process of converting from wireless internet to fiber optics. We already have fiber access at all of our buildings. This move will bring significant savings and is a much more fail safe system of communications.
4. There have been some movie recruits scouting our Administrative Offices building here in Estancia to do some shooting. They'll only be using the exterior of the building. A building use agreement has been drafted and is being reviewed by Mr. Wallin. We have requested that they shoot only on the weekends when the building is mostly empty.
5. The Willard Fire Department is moving towards the actual transitioning of the department's financial responsibility to Tarrant County. We are working on an agreement for operations and the transfer of their trucks. Details will be coming.

Public Requests: At the Discretion of the Commission Chair. For Information Only (**No Action Can Be Taken**). Comments are limited to three (3) minutes per person on any subject.

Fred Sanchez, Tajique resident, speaks. He worked for the City of Albuquerque for ten years and participated in the creation of its first noise ordinance. He would like to be part of any committee that is put together to work on a noise ordinance for the County. Also, he informs the Commission that there is an exposed gas pipeline in Moriarty, (Mountainair?) which is a great hazard. No one wants to take care of it, but someone has to. He also stated that he is elated that we are finally seeing some open Government. One of our Commissioners attended his Neighborhood watch meeting and contributed to the meeting which was great and there was a meeting in Torreon to discuss the proposed Road Policy. He thanks the Commission for taking these positive steps.

Brent Myrick, Moriarty resident, speaks. He informs the Commission that the Moriarty/Edgewood School District is in a budget crisis. One of their considerations is to do away with the Athletic Director position and the Athletic Trainer position. In Mr. Myrick's opinion, if they do this their athletics will be jeopardized. Approximately 40% of the students are involved in athletics in one form or another. Mr. Myrick is aware that the school district is funded by the State, but he wanted to make the Commission aware in the hopes that they can intercede in some way to help.

Michael Godey, resident, speaks. The Tajique Neighborhood Watch is having their Spring Cleanup on Sunday, April 26th at 2:00 pm. There will be a potluck afterwards beginning at approximately 4:00pm at Tom Negrete's home.

Billie Mitchell, resident, speaks. She was reviewing her bills and noticed that some of them listed "gross receipts (Edgewood)". She resides in Torrance, but her mailing address is in Edgewood. She wants to know if Torrance County is receiving her gross receipts taxes. Also, when will the proposed draft of the Road Policy be available for public viewing? Lastly, she wishes to compliment Madam Commissioner DuCharme; if the other Commissioners would ask the detailed questions that she does, "it would be a heck of a lot better Commission".

Cliff Everdeen, Melody Ranch resident, speaks. He is concerned about the proposed noise ordinance. He states that they have two dogs that they do not allow to bark. They have neighbors that have dogs that bark from approximately 8, 9, or 10 at night, and will bark for two hours at a time. He asks that there be a limit on how long they allow these animals to bark. Bernalillo County has an ordinance allowing 30 minutes max.

Hank Van Es, resident, speaks. He would like to address the proposed noise ordinance from a standpoint of jurisdiction. State statute 4-38-13 specifically gives the County powers over County property. There is nowhere that he has found that gives the County jurisdiction over private property.

Edwina Hewett, resident, speaks. She thanks each of the Commissioners for holding their District Road policy meetings. She would like to encourage the Commission to do one more round of meetings before holding the public hearing. She heard that many of the residents who attended the meetings were there to complain about their roads; they didn't realize the meetings were held to discuss the policy. With respect to the proposed noise ordinance, Ms. Hewett states that we are Torrance County and maybe the ordinance should be discussed in terms of subdivisions vs open areas, for example. Lastly, she thanks the State Auditor's Office for coming to the meeting; she wants the answers to whether our funds were adequately taken care of and whether we have the checks and balances in place to protect the taxpayers.

Michelle Jones, McIntosh resident, speaks. Ms. Jones, myself, comments in favor of item # 11- Presentation by International Trade Alliance & Request for Fiscal Assistance. This is a very exciting proposition that could bring many job

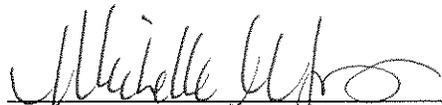
opportunities and growth to the County. She also comments on the proposed noise ordinance stating that we do live in a rural area and loud music and 'dog barking' rules should perhaps not apply.

Madam Commissioner DuCharme thanks Ms. Mitchell for her earlier compliment but states that her fellow Commissioners also should be complimented for their questions and comments.
